



The Lark Quartet has delighted audiences with its energy, passionate commitment and artistry since its inception in 1985. They have performed in many of the world's great cultural centers including Carnegie Hall, Lincoln Center, The Library of Congress, London's Wigmore Hall, L'Opéra de la Bastille in Paris and appeared at international festivals including Lockenhaus, the Schleswig-Holstein Festival, Mostly Mozart, Istanbul Festival, Wolftrap and the Beethoven Festival in Moscow. Promising to deliver "a performance of grace, proportion and burnished brilliance" (The Washington Post), The Lark Quartet offers audiences new insights into the art of chamber music through programs that begin with the ensemble virtuosity of the western tradition and continue into recent music from world cultures, all while regularly sharing the stage with dynamic collaborators.

Yousif Sheronick, percussion, has performed around the globe to critical acclaim, genre hopping with leading artists in the classical, world, jazz and rock music arenas. The New York

Times hails Yousif for his "dazzling improvisations" and his "wizardry on a range of humble frame drums". Yousif is considered one of the world's most versatile percussionists, with influences that are far reaching.



Pacific Guitar Ensemble

The Pacific Guitar Ensemble was formed in 2010 when two friends, classical guitarist David Tanenbaum and steel-string guitarist Peppino D'Agostino, decided they wanted to form a larger guitar ensemble that could perform a wide variety of repertoire. After they gathered together members of the guitar faculty from the San Francisco Conservatory of Music with some of its most exceptional alumni, combined nylon strings with steel, and electric basses with 17th century theorbos, a new eclectic group of pluckers was born.

While the Pacific Guitar Ensemble's repertoire features original music written by composers like Brazilian guitar legend Sergio Assad, the noted minimalist Belinda Reynolds, and the group's own brilliant steel-string stylist Peppino D'Agostino, it also includes fresh arrangements of great composers from Bach to Brahms, Dowland to Rossini. Guitarists like nothing better than to get together to play for and with each other, learning and copying, sharing and competing. The Pacific Guitar Ensemble is a group dedicated to keeping this dynamic process alive.

An active and enthusiastic educator, Fournier served as part of a pilot project to bring music education to elementary schools through after school programs in Appleton, Wisconsin. Her primary teachers include Chad Burrow, Melissa Koprowski, and Kelly Johnson.

// A musical sensation from Austria" wrote the Berlin Tagesspiegel of the young Minetti Quartett's debut at the Berlin Philharmonie in 2009. The name Minetti Quartett refers to a play by famous Austrian author Thomas Bernhard (1939-1989), who lived in Ohlsdorf, the birthplace of the quartet's two female members. The European Rising Star Series presented the Minetti Quartett during the 2008-09 season on the stages of the prestigious European concert halls. Die Presse in Vienna summed it up after one of those concerts: "The youthful freshness of the quartet's interpretations [has charmed] audiences since 2003. They are top musicians with spirit and dedication at work who charge the music of the classic and romantic periods with energy for the new millennium."

The Minetti Quartett has collected many important prizes since 2003 and international tours have brought the ensemble to the USA, South America, China and Japan. Since 2009, the Minetti Quartett is artist in residence at the Osttiroler String Festival. After completing individual studies in Vienna, the Minetti Quartett was coached by members of the famous Alban Berg Quartett and the Artis Quartett, and have worked with the Amadeus Quartet, Quatuor Mosaique and the Hagen Quartett.

Praised by Fanfare for its "wonderful, vital and buoyant performances," Trio Settecento's passionate and authoritative interpretations renew the pleasures of hearing beloved music from the Age of Enlightenment while also revealing the delights of new discoveries. Comprised of period strings and keyboard, imagination, vigor, technical polish and historical insight have made the Trio's performances appealing to audiences and critics alike. Their programs consist of popular works and rarely heard repertoire. Wrote Gramophone of their recording, An Italian Sojourn, "There isn't a piece that doesn't impress. This is as good a collection for a newcomer to the Baroque as it is for those who want to hear these works performed at a high level."

Trio Settecento was formed after the three members came together in 1996 to record the complete violin sonatas of George Frederick Handel and has appeared at the Boston Early Music Festival and the Music Institute of Chicago's Baroque Chamber Music Festival, as well as other performance venues around the U.S. "Trio Settecento proves that this music [Trio Settecento: A German Bouquet] was indeed a conversation among friends." (Minnesota Public Radio)

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
